Robert Davidson – had just attended the Local Plan pre meeting for Councillors and advised the May 2025 elections will not be going ahead. In the Council reorganisations, Cllr Bentley and other district leaders are going to push for five unitary councils within the district.

Fingringhoe will get some development as part of the Local Plan review.

- To review the quotes for a new village name plaque following discussion the Council agreed to review the site for size and suitability. A Locality grant towards costs of £700 has been granted by CCC City Cllrs Davidson and Powling.
