

COOK, ERIC ALFRED JOHN

Private Gloucestershire Regiment

Date of Death: 27/08/1946

Aged 18, born 21/4/1928

He was one of six soldiers under training, who were drowned on the gravel pits at Fingringhoe during an exercise. See "Accident at Fingringhoe". He was the eldest son of Alfred Henry Cook and Ellen Lillian Bennett. They lived at 2 Hill View Wortley Wotton under Edge Gloucestershire. He was a keen sportsman and particularly excelled at long distance running and Boxing. He was indentured as a grocer's apprentice with the International Tea Company of London, who had a store in Wotton under Edge.
